

Let's get into it: Types of Tents



- Frame Tents
 - White Top or Clear Top
 - 9' wide 50' wide
- Pole Tents
 - Basic White
 - Sailcloth
 - Typically ~40'-60' wide
- Structure Tents
 - Large scale, higher cost
 - 60'+ wide





Frame Tent vs. Pole Tent

Scalloped Valance




Straight Valance




Catenary Valance

Anchoring

- In-Ground Anchors
 - Stakes 811
 - Permanent Anchors
- Above-Ground Anchors
 - Ballasts / Blocks
 - Barrels not recommended





Choosing the Right Tent

- Anchoring restrictions
- Spatial needs
- Aesthetics
- Seasonality
- Safety



Safety

Not the most exciting part, but the most important

- When tenting is done poorly, it is fundamentally dangerous
- Insufficient anchoring
 - Plan for soil type & weather
- Temporary power + metal + water
- Wind:
 - Above ~35 mph, it's not *that*
 the wind is blowing, it's *what*
 the wind is blowing
- Floods, lightning, snow
- Have an evacuation and extreme weather plan









Permits & Inspections

- Fire code is written on the state and local level
- Make sure you file in the right jurisdiction
- Communicate early and thoroughly
- Layer in time between inspection and the event start time to resolve any issues
- Make sure fire safety essentials are on your tent order
- Be on the same team as the fire marshal, with safety as the #1 focus







Guest Comfort



- Sidewalls
 - White
 - Window
 - Solid
 - Standard/Keder
- Heat
 - Think portable HVAC
 - No patio heaters!





- Air Conditioning
 - A significant investment
 - Takes time to be effective
- Fans
 - More cost-effective
 - Pulls lots of power
- Gutters



Lighting

- String + Bistro Lights
- Chandeliers
- Pendants + Lanterns
- LED or Conventional PARs
- Fluorescents
- Production Lighting
 - Truss, rigging, moving lights





Building your off-site kitchen

- Space
- Walls for privacy or weather
- Functional lighting
- Heat/fans
- Tables prep & plating
- Convection ovens
- Hot boxes
- Fryers, grills, etc.
- Ignite Your Success

- Fire extinguishers
- Bussing/stewarding station
- Room for tabletop rental racks
- Proximity to main tent

Tips:

- Build your kitchen in AllSeated/Merri
- Review spatial needs with your client
- Get a quote from your rental provider
- Ask yourself: "What does this plan look like in inclement weather?"

- No matter what your role is in a tented event, ask for what you need well in advance
- Have the hard conversations up front on both budget & weather
